Getting back to the cemetery marking program, we will be wrapping up the weekend with a marking in Chatham. Even if you are unable to join us for the awards banquet and the meeting, we encourage you to attend the cemetery marking.

We have additional cemetery markings this year from the Kishwaukee, General Joseph Bartholomew, Elijah Smith and Fox Valley chapters. If you aren't able to attend the Awards Banquet and support the program through the silent auction, the program accepts personal donations or for a \$100 donation, ILSSAR will award a ILSSAR Cemetery Marking medal. For a \$35 donation, ILSSAR will award a Grave Marking pin (limited supply).

Cemetery Marking Program Plans Announced

The cost of the Cemetery Plaque (Sewah Studios) with post have risen to around \$3000 and it is getting harder for chapters to budget this enormous cost. The lead times have come down a bit but are still very long. The lead times a few years ago were 6-8 weeks, now they are 8-10 months.

Sewah Studios is not the only foundry. We are always looking for new Historical Plaque vendors so if you find one, please share.

We are already booked with 5 Cemetery Markings for 2024, Kishwaukee, Fox Valley, Springfield. General Joseph Bartholomew and Elijah Smith Chapters.

Starting in 2025 the standard GWEF donation will be \$1000 and ILSSAR donation will be \$1000 per plaque/ ceremony and the remaining balance of \$1,000 the chapter must come up with. We will have a MAXIMUM OF 5 CEMETERY MARKINGS PER YEAR GOING FORWARD STARTING IN 2025.

CHAPTER PRESIDENTS, it is never too early to send your Cemetery Marking requests to the ILSSAR President for 2025. The earlier the requests come in the better to ensure funding from the GWEF and ILSSAR. These requests when approved are on a first come first serve basis. We will only have 5 markings per year going forward from 2025.

CHAPTERS, personal donations from \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50 or \$100 always help. Chapters can have Silent Auctions or fundraisers throughout the year to raise money. Maybe for a \$500 donation from a person, family, or organization you can have that name or organization put on the plaque itself. The Illinois Society will be flexible and will work with all the chapters for reimbursement from GWEF and ILSSAR. We want to make sure when the invoice comes the chapter doesn't have to drain their entire savings waiting for reimbursement.

ILSSAR, for a \$100 donation the ILSSAR will award a ILSSAR Cemetery Marking Medal. (I have 3 medals left) For a \$35 donation the ILSSAR will award a Grave Marking Pin. (I have 21 pins left). These proceeds will go into the ILSSAR Cemetery Marking Fund.

Illinois Society February Meeting Highlights

The 250th celebration in 2026 of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence is soon upon us. At the national level, SAR is going to acknowledge ten years of recognition, which began with the anniversary of the Boston Tea Party on December 16, 2023, all the way to the signing of the Treaty of Paris, which will take place in 2033. The national website

<u>AMERICA250SAR.org</u> contains a wealth of information chapters can use to mark the many events that led to and supported our independence.

Society membership is currently 954 members across 15 chapters down from 970.

Beginning in 2025, Patriot Grave Marking Subsidies are increasing from \$500 to \$1,000. There are currently 5 markings planned in 2024.

Every chapter is encouraged to utilize the "Americanism Report", a great tool to document monthly activities contributing to the SAR mission.


In addition to the scholarships presentation, the chapter will present its first Rumbaugh Historical Oration Contest winner Shreya C. Nallamothu with a certificate and \$250.

The Joseph S. Rumbaugh Historical Oration Contest is open to all students attending 9th through 12th grades in public, parochial, or private schools; or home-school students studying at the same grade levels. Participants must write an original oration of not less than five minutes, or more than six minutes. The oration must be delivered from memory and without the use of notes or any kind of props. The subject of the oration shall deal with an event, a personality, or a document pertaining to the Revolutionary War with a mention of our nation's 250th anniversary celebration. It is essential that each oration show the relationship it bears to America today. Orations are judged based upon its composition, delivery, significance, historical accuracy, and relevance to the 250th anniversary.

The George Washington Endowment Fund (GWEF) was created to establish a permanent restricted fund, the income of which would provide annual funding for the support of NSSAR unfunded or underfunded committees and special projects. 80% of the corpus earnings are withdrawn for NSSAR project support. The remaining 20% is added to the permanent fund.

George Washington Fellows

are elected through a single \$1000 gift or annual installment payment plan as a permanent gift to fund. It is not limited to SAR members; spouses, children, grandchildren, nephews and nieces are also eligible.

All new George Washington Fellows receive a beautiful gold pin, a certificate acknowledging their GW Fellow status, and listed with all GW Fellows in the SAR Genealogical and Research Library.
